

A final push and we're there

We are pleased to announce that we have sold part of our car park for a very generous price.

We were thrilled to accept the offer made to us and now we need to pull in the rest of the finances.

We will be sending out a letter soon to all members of our congregation asking if you can help us get over the line. The project of our New Community Hall, is finally being costed at the time of writing and will be going to three builders for their demolition and building tenders.

This project started in 2014 and it hasn't been easy to keep it moving forward. During this covid-19 period it has been even harder because our church and hall just looks derelict and our opportunity to meet has been curtailed.**BUT NEW LIFE IS RETURNING.**

We want to thank all of you who have already given your generous gifts of finance, time and prayer. We don't want to be a church that is always asking for money, but we feel that this final push will help us build a hall which will be self sustaining. We will be having an array of PV panels on the roof which will generate enough electricity for both the church building and the hall too including both heating systems. We want to

We also thank those amongst us who have diligently put in grant applications bought & sold preserves and vegetables, goods sold on Facebook, sold jewellery and much more..... **we are where we are because of your largesse.**

mitments that everyone on the ministry team at Christ Church has made.

So that whatever activity we're involved in, whether its Podchurch or working towards a Ministry Area, we've got those four commitments in the background; they must inform *how* we do whatever we do.

They're quite strict parameters within which we've got to act. I found myself having new respect for Trystan, Jenny, Chris, Sion, Ian, Andrew, Dominic. They've never let on that they are working within these tight imperatives. It's not a straightforward gig. Which is why your support and wonderfully affirming messages are so important. Thank you. Letter from John Walrond, retired reader from Christ Church

DÉJÀ VU

I have to say that Trystan's announcement of the creation of The North Cardiff Ministry Area, reuniting St Isan, Lisvane and St Faiths with Christchurch brought a wry smile to my lips. I recalled the day in 1994 when Neville and I beat the new parish bounds to delineate Christ Church Parish on the map to the satisfaction of the Archdeacon and subsequently the Diocesan Conference. At that Conference there were several voices ranged against the idea of the separation which was seen by many of the senior clergy as a step in the wrong direction although, of course, it was passionately desired by most of the Christchurch worshippers.

The rest is, of course, history and no one could deny that the separation with all its painful aspects released an explosion of pent up energies that with a few bumps and dips have produced the wonderful flourishing Parish that we have now become.

But in the background of all this there lies a perpetual problem for the whole Anglican Communion in England as well as Wales. The location of the ancient parish churches seldom matches the distribution on the ground of the worship-

pers: daughter churches to the old mother church are formed and eventually tensions over staffing, finance and pastoral outreach arise.

My very first involvement with parish administration was in a Midlands Parish where such tensions led to PCC meetings at which there was a conspicuous absence of Christian brotherly love.

I don't believe that what Trystan announced will be a return to the status quo ante. I am sure that there will parishioners in the other parishes involved that will have the same misgivings as some in Christ Church will no doubt have about this development. The simple fact remains that the whole explosion of population growth in North Cardiff has created huge problems in Christian outreach for the Anglican community and the other denominations too.

How to keep our separate identity which has produced our wonderful Parish whilst at the same time being part of a team that reaches out further is not going to be easy. It is, nevertheless, an inescapable Christian duty. We'll need clergy and laity alike to think and pray about it.
