**NEW HALL NEWS** We are pleased to announce that we have sold a section of our car park to help pay for the New Church Hall. More next month !


### AUDREY PRYCE

### What's a Ministry Area?

In the same way that Jesus worked in a team, Ministry Areas are a return to a more collaborative way of working to enable God's people to work together effectively and creatively for church growth. By creating Ministry Areas we establish a stronger Christian presence in our communities that will enable us collectively to do more, today and into the future.

Ministry Areas are large parishes led by a team of clergy and lay people who draw on each other's strengths to increase the impact of the message of Jesus.

### Do we have a choice?

No. The whole of Wales is moving to Ministry Areas. And, anyway, I'm not sure that there are reasons for *not* moving.

### Who's in our ministry area?

Us.....and St Denys Lisvane, St Faith Llanishen and St Isan Llanishen

### What's our name?

North Cardiff Ministry Area

### What's our timeline?

The new Ministry Area should kick off in January 2022

### Who's working on this from Christ Church?

On the Ministry Area Transition Team are Colin Francis, Rev Trystan and myself, Eleanor Williams, (who will be the Lay Chair of the Ministry Area). These are supported by Dominic and Gerald in the Christ Church focus group. If we need to check anything more widely, there's a pre-Ministry Area group in the church. This comprises people with a particular expertise in an area of church life who steer our contributions in the Transition Team meetings

### What differences will I see?

- Instead of a PCC, there'll be a Congregation Committee who make decisions at a church level. They will make sure that Christ Church is represented at the Ministry Area Council
- On a financial front, for the time being, we'll continue to operate in much the same way that we do at the moment. Any changes will have to be approved by the Ministry Area Transition Team, which has Christ Church representatives.

- I hope there'll be more opportunity to work with others in our Ministry Area. But
