

I usually have two or three on the go so thought I could recommend a couple that you might like to have at your hand. Firstly, 'Tidings of Comfort & Joy' A Christmas Feast of Faith and Fun, compiled by Pam Rhodes. An anthology of stories, poems, & carols - some faith based, some humorous, some nostalgic. You may have come across some before, but others will be new. You can dip in and out as and when you please. They will definitely help enhance the tidings of comfort and joy to be found at Christmas. It would make a good gift as well.

Do you have friends or family members who claim that science and faith are incompatible? Are you intrigued by the motivation of eminent scientists who are also Christians?



trigued by the motivation of eminent scientists who are also Christians? "True Scientists, True Faith" may be just the book for you. Edited by R.J. Berry, former Professor of Genetics at University College London, it contains the faith testimonies of twenty leading scientists.

They include Francis Collins the former head of the Human Genome Project and the current Director of the National institute of Health, USA. The Human Genome Project, you will know, successfully sequenced the complete biochemical make-up of DNA. Collins' shares his own journey to faith. He eloquently describes DNA as the "language by which God spoke life into being" and reveals his "awe in surveying this most significant of all biological texts".

Other testimonies come from scientists who have held eminent positions such as; Director-General of the Meteorological Office; Director of the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew Chief Executive of a UK Research Council.

"True Scientists, True Faith" provides intriguing glimpses into the personalities, careers and faith journeys of twenty scientists in a range of specialties including Astrophysics, Evolutionary Paleobiology, Ornithology, Nanomaterials, and Marine Geophysics.



This book offers a lively, engaging, and accessible look at the theme of the Incarnation, the mysterious event at the heart of Christmas, using personal stories, illustrations from popular culture and the arts, as well as daily Bible readings.

The starting-point is what the 'Word made flesh' means for us and how the first Christmas should still have an impact on our everyday lives. We will be taken on an absorbing journey to help us recognise the person of Jesus in the people we meet, the conversations we have, and even in our relationship with nature and the arts.

By the end of our journey, we will not only recognise Christ in others, but also in ourselves, as we model ourselves on him and share his love, compassion and peace with our neighbours, whoever they are and whatever their backgrounds.

NEW HALL BOOKING SECRETARY WANTED


Gill Barker has organised the bookings for the church hall for the past 9 Years. She is finding now that due to family commitments she doesn't have enough time to do the job.
